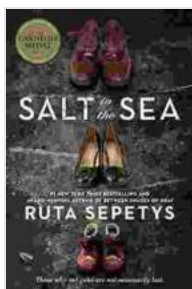


Salt to the Sea: A Haunting Tale of the Wilhelm Gustloff Disaster

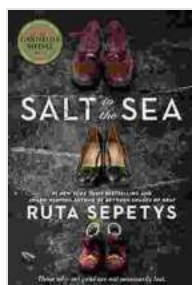

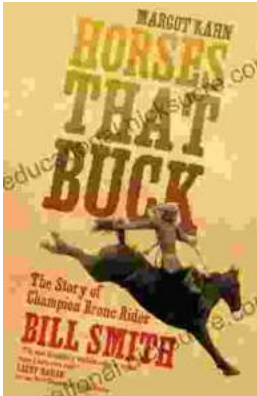

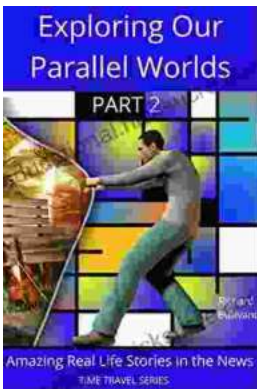
